With climate risks rising, the solution may lie closer to home, right at the localised level






The Rising Pressure

Why Constituency-Level Planning Matters

Top-down plans can miss hyperlocal realities But MLAs, MPs & panchayats are best placed to:

• Tailor strategies to local risks

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- Align development with resilience goals
- Build climate capacity within communities

The Climate Opportunity at the Grassroots

₹169 billion/year is allocated to MPs and MLAs
These funds can be steered toward climate-smart projects—
From climate-resilient crops to early warning systems

Local leaders can be at the forefront of shaping regionspecific solutions across India's diverse geographies
